





LIBERIA

THE BEST IS YET TO COME!

On November 24, 2022, sacrificing Thanksgiving with family and friends, seven delegates from the United States attended the 2022 National Convention in Monrovia, Liberia.

The US delegation wanted to experience a "real mission trip". For three days they stayed on a Palm Nut farm, rising at 6:30 am for Morning Glory which consisted of worship and a word from Bishop Zarway. Temporary houses were constructed for the comfort of the delegates. They experienced first-hand from beginning to end the growing, chopping, separating, thrashing, harvesting and production of the actual palm nut. Manually harvesting Palm Oil is a laborious process taking about 11-12 hours. Mother Zarway's vision is to transform the Palm Nut Farm into a state-of-the-art development that has the capacity to support the other ministries financially.

In response to the great need in Liberia, a new organization was created, by Pastor Jeremiah Jones, Liberia Rising Connecting Hands Across the Sea, a fund-raising organization that strictly supports the Liberian ministries; i.e. church, stationery clinic, a mobile clinic, and a school.

In response to the great need in Liberia, a new organization was created by Pastor Jeremiah Jones, Liberia Rising Connecting Hands Across the Sea, a fund-raising organization that strictly supports the Liberian ministries; i.e. church, stationery clinic, a mobile clinic, and a school.

Bishop R. C. Lawson and Missionary Margaret Giles Johnson planted missions in Zuie, Campwood and Bokay Town, Liberia. In 1979 Bishop W. L. Bonner built on that gospel foundation and planted a church in Monrovia where he and his delegation baptized hundreds of souls in one service. Apostle Matthew Norwood continued the legacy for the next forty years by making annual trips to Monrovia. Pastor Jeremiah Jones joined the delegation in 2017. Fast forward to 2022, the vision of Bishop Zarway is to build a Cathedral seating 4,000. The convention was held at the Cathedral; although, the building was incomplete. HATS' mission is to financially support these thriving ministries connecting our sisters and brothers in Liberia with those in the diaspora.

Dr. Martha Zarway has a vision for a Palm Nut farm which, when harvested and brought to market could support the church, the clinic, the mobile clinic and a school.

Greater Faith Ministries Global Missions Team London, UK

Greater Faith Ministries Global Missions was formalized in 2008, in response to the vision of Pastor Bishop Lennox Hamilton. Its' aims are to enable the church to respond to worldwide events and to assist in the development of the church worldwide mission / growth. Its' Objective is to raise funds to facilitate the church aims and to facilitate the relief of worldwide poverty and deprivation.

Greater Faith Ministries is not a mega-church, yet the giving has been mega from the congregants. The Global Mission Team has done so through our annual Global Mission service, and through fundraising events and individual donations, e.g., all the money and donations made to the Papa Orphanage Siliguri India over a number of years came from individuals in the church. And in 2021 a £1000. The donation was made by an anonymous person.

Our Global Missions Department started by responding to international disasters and donated to a number of international organizations as the Disaster Emergency Appeal (DEA); the Bible Society; Compassion UK; Christian Child Development; and UN Refugee Appeal. These organizations have responded to appeals for help in areas of Education; Disaster and Famine; Support for those with disabilities and mental health issues; War and conflict; Provision of food; social and personal needs; Improving the lives of girls and women; Business support; Therapeutic services, and Supporting orphans.

Fundraising efforts on behalf of Greater Faith Ministries has therefore contributed to the wellbeing of peoples in countries as the Caribbean; Africa, Europe, Asia, the Americas, Philippines, China, Haiti, India, Myanmar (formerly Burma), Nepal and Yemen to name a few

In addition GM has partnered directly with organizations on the ground in countries Ghana, Grenada, Jamaica, India, Kosovo and Congo, over several years. For example, we supported Liberian refugees in Ghana and contributed to their projects and relocation costs for business and education. Some have ended but others as the improvement of a school in Prampram Accra Ghana, continues.

Greater Faith Ministries also saw the need to be part of the local community and wanted to contribute to initiatives in the local area by responding to the needs of the Black community in who provided education Lewisham, empowerment projects, and projects that address the discouragement of gang violence in our streets. To conclude Greater Faith Ministries' Global Missions Team, over the years, has ensured the range of initiatives we supported are extensive, which reflects the generosity of the church members. The Global Missions Team's annual event at the church highlights the work undertaken throughout the year and accounts for the funds given, as well as to further raise

funds. This event is well attended and usually includes presentations and representatives from local, national, and global organizations that are seeking support for their much needed work and provision.

Despite the curtail in activity due to the global shutdown relating to the covid pandemic, our last service was in 2021 when we had the most amazing blessing so far from one anonymous benefactor.

Going forward the GFM - GM team remains committed to its aims and objectives and to developing a new fund-raising strategy for 2023 and beyond. We intend to make an even greater impact and will fully enhance the use of our new and more community accessible premises



Global Missions Personal Story

The close of 2022, for me, was an effort to explore opportunities to increase the Kingdom of God in the motherland, Africa! Although my first venture started many years ago as a college student, I guess I've never forgotten that first experience of being on the soil of my forefathers and mothers. Back then my first visit to Africa was to Benin, West Africa, and Togo. Since then, I was blessed to visit Ethiopia, Kenya, and Uganda. But in 2022, the Lord blessed me with the privilege of visiting places in Africa I had never been to before. Africa is comprised of 54 countries and truly is the cradle of civilization. Africa is rich in land and minerals and of course its people. So, this time my journey brought me to South Africa. In Johannesburg, South Africa, I visited the place where the former President of South Africa Nelson and Winnie Mandela, lived and fought courageously, along with so many other South Africans. So, the people could be free from the tyranny of apartheid. I visited the street where Archbishop Desmond Tutu and Mandela lived in the town of Soweto. But what burdens me the most is seeing and sensing the fingerprints of colonialism that is still engrained in society as many black South Africans struggle to have a decent living. Much work remains to fight for economic and social injustice as it still does in America. The same divisive tactics played out in America to divide people and make one group feel inferior to another is being played out in subtle and systemic ways in South Africa. But to me, it's an opportunity to raise our voices there also. As Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere". Furthermore, I had an opportunity to minister and preach the Word of God to my brothers and sisters in Johannesburg and in Durban, South Africa, where the Pentecostal flames are still blowing. I also for the first time visited Cape Town, South Africa, where I was able to meet with some of the local pastors introduced to me through my Global Mission connections. Finally, I had the opportunity to visit a place that until recently was only known for its atrocities of genocide. History bears out that in 1994 the Hutu people launched a campaign to exterminate the Tutsi people; with the aid, input and divisive tactics of the European colonialists. I pray that this atrocity will never happen again. But currently, you wouldn't believe how beautiful Rwanda (formally Rhodesia) is today. It is one of the cleanest places in Africa and is well on its way to being a leading African nation under the stable leadership of President Paul Kagame. Through the grace of God and divine connections, I was able to minister in Rwanda at the Light Gate Church. Finally, we acknowledge the work that has gone on in Africa by COOLJC leaders, like our founder, the late Bishop Robert C. Lawson, my former pastor, the late Chief Apostle William L. Bonner, Mother Ethel Mae Bonner, Apostle Matthew Norwood, Mother Miriam Norwood, Apostle Robert L. Sanders, Sr., Mother Janice Sanders, Mother Pandora Williams, and Mother Dorothy Anderson. And current leaders like Mother Graham of Sierra Leon, Bishop Bryan Williams of Canada, and Bishop Nathaniel Zarway and Dr. Martha Zarway of Liberia, West Africa. We must continue the rich legacy in the motherland as we have much to gain for the Kingdom of God. I hope you will join me in the future to help keep that vision alive.



The purpose of our GMD is to first exemplify our love and concern for those who labour in the field and to encourage those workers with as much aid feasible and to give financial assistance to the Resident Bishops, District Elders, Pastors and Missionaries for:

- a)The purpose of aiding the building and restoration of churches, schools and clinics. b)Purchase of land for churches, schools and clinics.
- c)Payment of salaries for native and foreign resident teachers, doctors and nurses.
- d)To provide educational opportunities for (native men and women) Clergy and Missionaries who are committed to C.O.O.L.J.C.
- e)Purchase of vans, boats, bicycles, etc. to be used for the ministry.
- f)o provide travel / visit opportunities of Native Residents to the United States. Provide allowances / stipends for eligible resident clergy and/or Missionaries.

"The liberal soul shall be made fat: and he that watereth shall be watered also himself."

Proverbs 11:25 The work in the foreign field has been blessed over the years because of the love, commitment and sacrificial giving of God's people who sincerely care!

Jesus Christ is our greatest example of what a true missionary is. His life was a "pattern of good works." He had and has a heart of compassion. He fed the hungry, healed the sick, opened the eyes of the blind and made the lame walk. He encouraged those who felt "cast down." Jesus Christ cared for the poor and even raised the dead.

Today, we are some 2000 years removed from the resurrection of Jesus Christ, yet the need is still great, the call is one of urgency. Souls are yet hungry and need to be fed both natural and spiritual food, souls are yet blind and in need of natural and spiritual sight; souls are yet lame and need help in their life's walk, both naturally and spiritually; souls are yet "cast down" and need a natural lift and a spiritual lift.

Our first directive from the Lord is clear and concise, "GO." The salvation of souls must be our number one priority. In order to "go," funds are essential. In order to engage in Global Foreign Missions we must not think we can adequately operate without sufficient funds. To help spread the gospel sufficient funds are a requirement. To build churches, schools and clinics funds must increase. To educate our young men and women so they can teach and train others, funds are essential. "Because we Care, We Must Give More." The successful establishment of the Church of Our Lord Jesus Christ in various parts of the world is the result of much labour and individual sacrifice of many who have already gone home to be with the Lord Jesus. Our Founding Father the Late Bishop R.C. Lawson left us a challenge to "Add Thou To It." Our Chief Apostle, Apostle W.L. Bonner, has fulfilled that mandate. Apostle Matthew Norwood, Mother Miriam Norwood, Bishop Edwin Johnson, Bishop C. Kelly, Mother M. Giles Johnson and many others must be acknowledged and commended for their years of arduous labour in the Foreign Field. Those of us who remain have a legacy to maintain. We must continue. "For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have shewed toward His name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister." (Hebrews 6:10)
